



Just before the Easter holidays we were thrilled to learn we were successful in securing over £10,000 in funding from Thomas Howell Education fund. Miss Sieminski has worked extremely hard to put together our application and together with the children, we have decided to spend the money on a wooden playframe, designed by the children. We are developing our sensory garden and Nurture provision further too. The children are very excited about this new project, which is due to commence early June.

On World Book Day, we were fortunate to welcome Lorna Gibson (Toots Design) in to meet the children. Lorna is famous for writing the children's picture book 'Mr Bear's Christmas' which was recently narrated by Stephen Fry and shown on BBC. Lorna kindly provided an opportunity for all the children of Ysgol Derwenfa to ask questions about her writing process and even brought Mr Bear and his little friend Mouse for us to meet! Thank you for your kind gifts and best wishes for the future.





We would also like to thank New Directions for their support with prizes for our World Book Day craft competition! Children were asked to decorate an empty toilet roll tube as their favourite book character. We had some fabulous entries and each winner were awarded with a £15 WHSmith voucher! 




For our Eisteddfod, in Expressive Arts, the children created daffodil art with Miss Sieminski, using water colours as part of their piece. Mr Jones (Headteacher) was also delighted with the standard of handwriting as part of the handwriting competition.

As part of our Victorian focus, the children were eager to visit a Victorian museum, and on 18th April we were fortunate enough to visit Blists Hill, a Victorian Town in Telford. We had to wait a little longer than first anticipated as the original date for our trip was postponed due to heavy snow! As you can see from the photographs, we had a great time exploring the Victorian Town.

We learned how to create a candle using the 'dipping' technique, as well as traveling underground on a Victorian mine train. We also treated the children to a tasty treat where they got to try chips from the 'Fried Fish Dealers' cooked in the Victorian style.










As part of our School Eisteddfod celebrations, our writing focus has been poetry. The children were introduced to a famous senses poem titled 'A taste of France'. We explored what it means to be Welsh, including listening to Welsh pop music, and traditional songs and researching our country online. Once the children had collated their ideas, they planned individual sense poems titled 'A Taste of Wales'.

After two weeks off during Easter, the children returned to School eager to explore their new whole school topic 'from the sea, to the sky and beyond'. After a lengthy class discussion, the children decided to learn about space in more detail, with our hook being 'mission to planet Mars'. We used Google Jamboard to collaborate during the planning process, which has provided an exciting opportunity for the children to lead their class learning journey. Over the past few weeks, we have made a promising start to the new topic, writing our own stories titled 'Mission to Mars', researching the planets, creating astronaut artwork using natural materials, and creating a dance piece in small groups using the song 'Spaceman' by Sam Ryder as a stimulus. I can't wait to see what else the children achieve during the rest of the Summer term!







On May 4th, we celebrated the Coronation of King Charles III. The children were eager to create their own crowns, which resulted in pupil voices prevailing as the children explored our forest for materials to add to their crowns. I'm sure you would all agree that their crowns look very impressive indeed!

We celebrated the Coronation of **King Charles III** by having a themed picnic and dressing in red, white and blue. We also created our own abstract portraits of the King.










